# WHAT IS 'THE WAGGON CLUB'?

The Waggon Club is a members' club for serving and retired TA/Regular Army officers with service in TA Transport Units so that they can continue to meet their contemporaries and foster GS Wagons Marks V and VI were claimed to embody most of and enjoy the bonds of friendship formed whilst on military service. Their shared experience can contribute to the development of RLC doctrine.

The origins of the Club lie in the TROIKA dining club, an organisation of a small group of RASC Reserve Officers who used to meet in the early 1960s - with the aim of entertaining regular officer colleagues. Upon the formation of the Royal Corps of Transport in 1965, the TROIKA club was disbanded. In due course, the Waggon Club was formed by – as the name implies – a small group of transport officers. We still have a few members who attended the first Waggon Club meeting in January 1971.

# WHAT ARE THE CLUB'S ACTIVITIES?

The Annual Members' Dinner is held after the AGM in the Officers' Mess, Headquarters RLC TA (former home of RCT Specialist Units) in Grantham. It is the Club's 'Regimental Night' and overnight accommodation is usually possible for an extra charge.

Other events (e.g. curry lunches, site visits and lectures) are organised by the Committee from time to time in various parts of the country. These are of a social nature - for members and their partners.

#### WHO MAY JOIN THE CLUB?

You are eligible for Ordinary Membership if you are a serving or retired officer of RCT (V) or predecessor RE (V) and RASC (TA) units; a serving or retired officer of RLC (V) units; or a serving or retired officer of other corps, having served with RCT (V) or predecessors. Officers of all ages are welcome - and members' ranks range from Lieutenant to Major-General.

Membership is also open by invitation of the Committee to serving or retired regular officers who have served or have had a close association with Units of the RLC (V), RCT (V) or The joining subscription is £12.00 which includes a Club tie. predecessors - RE (V) and RASC (V).

# The GS Wagon Mark X

the recommendations of the 1883 Committee on Military Land Transport, but failed by having too wide a turning circle. In 1888, the Mark VII Wagon also conformed generally to the I wish to apply to join The Waggon Club. I enclose a recommendations of 1883, the bodywork being light, strong and flexible, built mainly of wood, to minimum ironwork. However, it had a bevelled front locker which allowed the fore carriage a greater sweep and gave an improved turning circle of 39ft. The Please send me my Club Tie - Bold or Feint Narrow pattern Mark VIII included more improvements and cost just £95. It was used in large numbers during Boer War. When a follow-on version evolved in line with the 1901 War Office recommendations (requiring a strengthened and improved perch), the Mark IX in 1903 cost £72.

Introduced in 1905, the Mark X was a modification



of the Mark IX, but used cheaper materials for economy, resulting in a cost of about £60. It had a slightly shorter body and loading platform.

The perch pin was connected directly to the axle tree. dispensing with both check chains and stay. The footboard was extended beyond the box seat and supported from

The Mark XI was identical with the Mark X - except that it had dust caps. As the last horse-drawn GS wagon used by the British Army, it was in service until the 1920s – when the army's wheeled transport became fully motorised.


